## TEACHING OBJECTIVES: WHEN THE DOCTOR HATES THE PATIENT

At the end of this session, students will:

- 1) Be able to identify specific theoretical aspects of the phenomenon of "othering" of difficult or threatening patients
- 2) Recognize behavioral, attitudinal, and linguistic signs of "othering" in three specific patient populations: a) noncompliant diabetic patient b) drug-abusing patient c) patient from a different cultural background
- 3) Be able to generate specific alternative responses in similar patient care situations that exemplify humanism, empathy, and compassion

- 1) What is the doctor/health care professional's perspective? What makes them adopt this attitude?
- 2) How might the patient be feeling?
- 3) What do you think might be other ways of approaching the patient?
