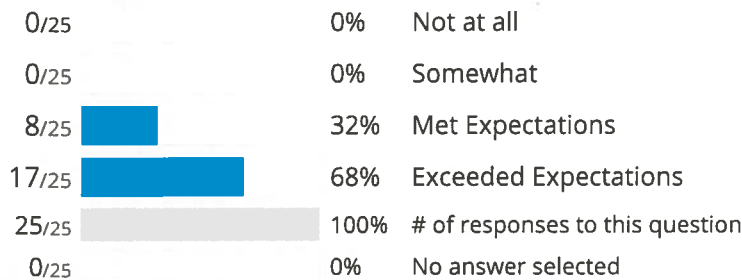


Survey: Illuminations Event Feedback - Poetry of Healing and Hope - 1/10/19

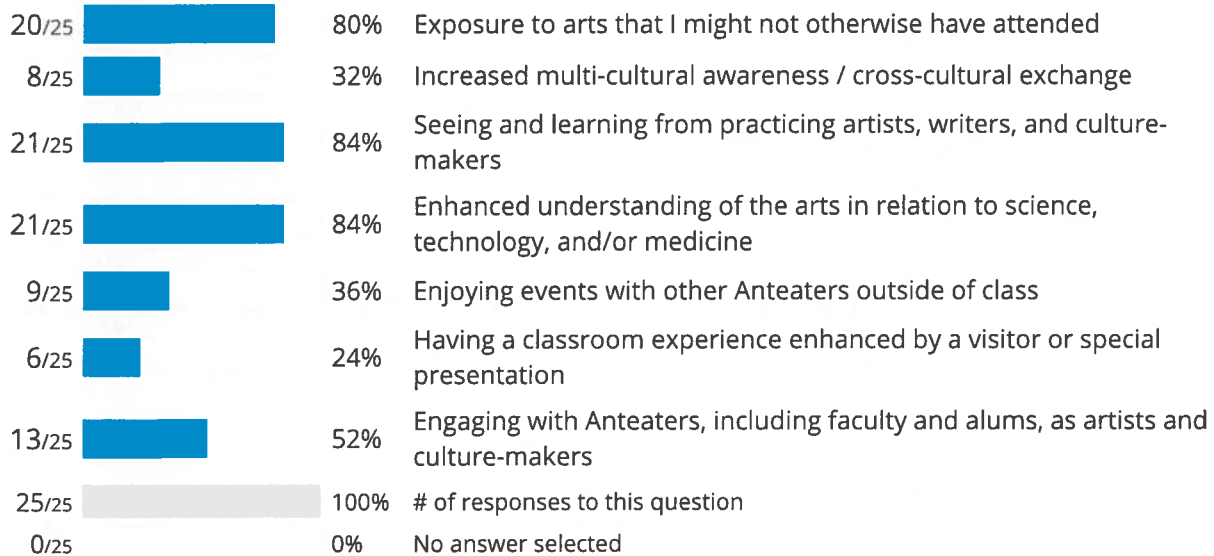
Responses to 9 questions

- Poetry readings and discussions
- The different poets on the panel sharing and reading their poetry. The workshop was added this year and helped in freestyle writing
- The presenters were exceptional and their works touching. I enjoyed all their poems and the event was well organized.

- It was so enjoyable to listen to each poet read her/his own poetry. Only they could add the expression needed in order to "see" their vision. It was also so nice to be told the reason/inspiration for the poem.
- The poets gave excellent, illuminating backgrounds to their work, about half of which penetrated me to the core and made me more human.
- The information about medicine and healing, and the discussion after the poetry readings.
- Hearing how talented my colleagues are; good poetry; meeting an intelligent undergrad (often not even found in post grads these days) ; expression of emotions of treating patients expressed in a different way than prose

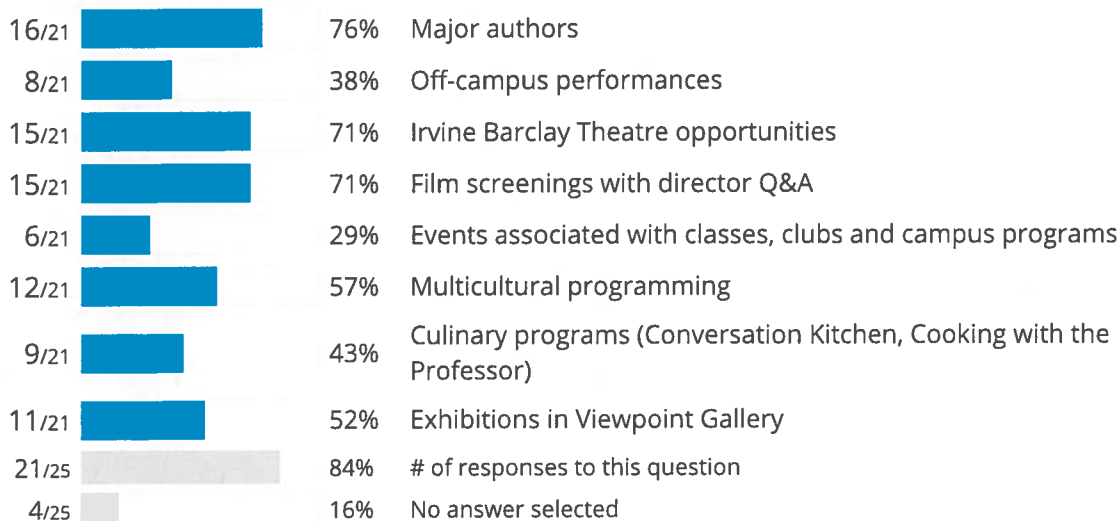


5. What kinds of Illuminations events do you especially value and appreciate? [Check all that interest you]

- More poetry nights! Serve wine!









