I too felt the 1st stanza, 2nd line is too wordy - and definitely support your choosing sadness over frustration (an overused and vague word).

I'd also recommend you take a second look at the final line stanza 2. It seems too long, too full of words. Could you possibly remove the "and"? Perhaps choose one or the other of the two wonderful images?

Again, this is a terrific poem. Everyone who's read it has resonated to it. Thank you for choosing Family Medicine as an outlet for your work.

COMMENTS TO EDITOR II: This is a beautiful poem, reviewers loved it - as do I. The author has made the minor changes requested, and if possible, it is even more affecting. An enthusiastic accept!
