In any case, I reccomend minor revision, with the intent to publish.

COMMENTS TO AUTHOR: This is a completely lovely, heartwarming, and uplifting essay. Everyone who has read it feels more happy and hopeful. We are just glad you decided to share this wonderful example of a truly team-based practice.

I agree that the very minor suggestions of reviewer 1 could slightly improve an already very well-written manuscript. Perhaps you yould introduce your role as a family physician by saying p. 1, line 11, "As a family doc, I had charts to write..." In terms of the incomplete sentences, p. 1, para 3, they are a bit awkward. You could solve this problem either with a colon after "together," then semi-colons each time you introduce a new character. But because these are such long fragments, that might read rather awkwardly. Another approach would be as follows: line 28-38 "Maria, who...hastily constructed, was there. So was Paul, who... Jeffrey had made it as well. He takes patients' blood pressure... Laura, who makes sure... was part of the group as well, smiling and embarrassed [or however she was feeling that her birthday was being celebrated]." This is just a suggestion, but please play around with this paragraph.

We have very little to improve upon such a perfect little gem. Thank you for offering it to us.

COMMENTS TO EDITOR II: This is an easy one, an essay that was near pitch-perfect when it arrived, and now has its small flaws improved as per reviewer suggestions. We should accept it quickly and gratefully. One of the best we've received.
