COMMENTS TO AUTHOR: Thank you for such a lovely essay. It is both a specific tribute to your mother, who sounds like a remarkable woman, and to mothers, especially working mothers, everywhere, who inspire their daughters toward full and meaningful lives. We would like to request a few minor revisions to refine an already excellent piece of writing.

- 1) In contrast to reviewer 2, I believe the lyrical, quasi-poetic style of the essay is well suited to the themes of gratitude and appreciation you express. The repetition of "what my mother remembers" and "what I remember" in my view add to the poignancy and power of the writing. Nevertheless, please note the reviewer's comments, and make any changes you feel will strengthen the piece.
- 2) Please note a few words or phrases in the attached edited copy which could be improved with a more specific substitute.

Again, thank you for writing this essay, which puts into language what so many daughters feel.
